Seminary Options

Consider pursuing seminary studies. We offer a Graduate Certificate in Christian Studies, MDiv, MA in Religion, or MA in Christian Leadership.

FS501 Formation in God's Story I will be offered in an intensive format meeting three days the week of January 4 followed by weekly online for six weeks. This course provides time and space for students to pay prayerful attention to their formational journey through listening to their life narrative from birth until the present. Along with this picture of story-listening they will also locate their personal story in the larger picture of God's story as recorded in scripture.

BVG 621 Interpreting the Biblical Text will be offered online during spring semester. This class currently meets the Gateway Bible survey/Anabaptist hermeneutics requirement. The class is available for seminary credit or participant audit.

Graduation and Blessing

Due to COVID-19 we were not able to hold our regular graduation festivities. This year we honored 14 graduates with a virtual video blessing in May. Nine students received the Master of Divinity degree, and five students received the Master of Arts in Christian Leadership degree. Three are pastoring in Mennonite congregations, three in United Methodist congregations, one in a Church of the Brethren congregation, and two in international churches. One graduate is the director of music in an Anglican Church and one graduate is a chaplain at a retirement community.
