Prior to the visit, Zion focused its worship services on the importance of the global church and our Mosaic relationships. Below is an excerpt from Pastor Jordan's sermon on July 10, based on Acts 10.

EATING THE LOCAL FOOD and graciously accepting hospitality is one of the best things we can do as cultural outsiders. Eating another's food opens doors to new relationships and for the Spirit of God to shake things up.

In Acts 10, both Peter and Cornelius are transformed. God's initiative to bring them together gives us a taste—literally—of what it is like to come together as an intercultural church.

Eating new foods is a simple but profound act of surrendering to God's mission to bring all people together through Jesus Christ, without sacrificing our deep cultural identities.

May we, like Peter and Cornelius, lean into the blurred lines between guest and host. May we do so with the confidence that it is God who is setting the table and bringing us together. May we come to the table eager to learn from one another in a spirit of mutual transformation.

God has set the table. We just need to show up... and eat the food.

The Mosaic Conference Board has elected Roy Williams, Pastor of College Hill Mennonite Church in Tampa, FL, as the Assistant Moderator-Elect for Mosaic Conference.

The election of Williams is a new process, as this is the first time since the origin of Mosaic Conference in 2020 that we will be naming a new Assistant Moderator. If approved by the Delegate Assembly on Nov. 5, Williams will become Assistant Moderator, and Angela Moyer Walter will become Moderator on January 1, 2023. Ken Burkholder will conclude his term as Moderator on December 31, 2022.



Mosaic Conference to Review Relationships with Mennonite Church USA

ON JULY 18, the Mosaic Conference Board moved to form a task force to lead a listening process and review of the Conference's relationships with Mennonite Church USA (MC USA). The task force is made up of Board members, staff, and nominated members from across the Conference's diverse constituency. The task force's goal is to listen to each Mosaic community and ministry and to provide direction for further discernment at the upcoming Annual Assembly on November 5.

At the July meeting, the Board reviewed numerous letters from Mosaic congregations, pastors, and leaders, urging action in considering the ongoing relationships with MC USA. For many, the resolutions and decision-making processes at the MC USA Special Delegate Session in May demonstrated a disconnect with the denomination and Mosaic Conference's formation document and mission.

The Board and task force are committed to a thorough, thoughtful, and timely process of listening and discerning. Conference delegates will be notified of any balloting processes a month before the November Assembly. Listening to the Spirit as well as each other will require careful and thoughtful attention. When Nothing Has Changed, But Everything Seems Different

in Kansas City in late May, Mosaic Conference has hosted listening sessions. Nearly 100 delegates participated. A clear request emerged from the sessions for clarification of Mosaic's position regarding the narrowly passed "Resolution for Repentance and Transformation" in KC.

We are now living into our feelings about and responses to the vote. In reality, nothing has changed for Mosaic Conference. Denominational resolutions are non-binding for area conferences. The formation document that binds our reconciled Conference continues to stand. We still abide by the Confession of Faith in a Mennonite Perspective. Our specific Conference vision and mission statements remain the same.



Although nothing has changed, it can feel like everything is different. For some, A Resolution for Repentance and Transformation represents a significant departure from the history and practice of Christian tradition. There are calls within our Conference for immediate distancing from Mennonite Church USA. Others in the Conference desire more time to listen, reflect, and discern.

I believe in the work of the Spirit that drew Mosaic Conference together. The possibility of our shared witness is far greater than we have yet lived into. I invite us to rest in what we know has not changed for us as a Conference community. Let us lean into the Spirit's work as we discern our path forward, holding onto the things that endure: faith, hope, and love (I Corinthians 13:13).
