New Office Opens in Tamaqua

On June 24, St. Luke's Penn Foundation celebrated the grand opening of its new Psychiatric Associates office in Tamaqua with a ribbon cutting ceremony. This new location is part of the St. Luke's Rural Psychiatry Residency Program and will offer counseling, medication management, and other outpatient mental health services. Mental health care access, especially in rural communities, has been the #1 need identified in our Community Health Needs Assessment.



St. Luke's Introduces Two New Addiction Fellowship Programs

St. Luke's University Health Network has launched two new Addiction Fellowship programs: Addiction Medicine and Addiction Psychiatry. These programs provide structured, hands-on clinical training designed to prepare fellows for excellence in their respective fields. Under the guidance of board-certified physicians from a variety of specialties, fellows gain comprehensive exposure to multimodal approaches for managing the complexities of addiction. With the addition of these fellowships, St. Luke's now offers a total of four Graduate Medical Education programs in the field of mental health. (The other two are Psychiatry and Rural Psychiatry residencies.)



Understanding the Collaborative Care Model: A Team-Based Approach to Mental Health in Primary Care

St. Luke's Penn Foundation expanded its Collaborative Care Model this past year. Unlike traditional models, CoCM embeds mental health services within the primary care setting, making care more accessible and coordinated. It helps patients receive timely, effective treatment for common mental health conditions without the need to navigate separate systems.

On July 1, Grand View Health joined St. Luke's University Health Network, becoming the Network's 16th campus.
