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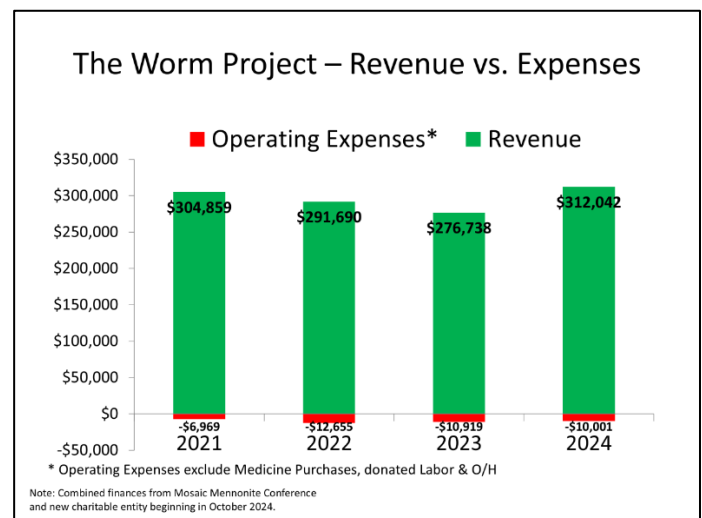
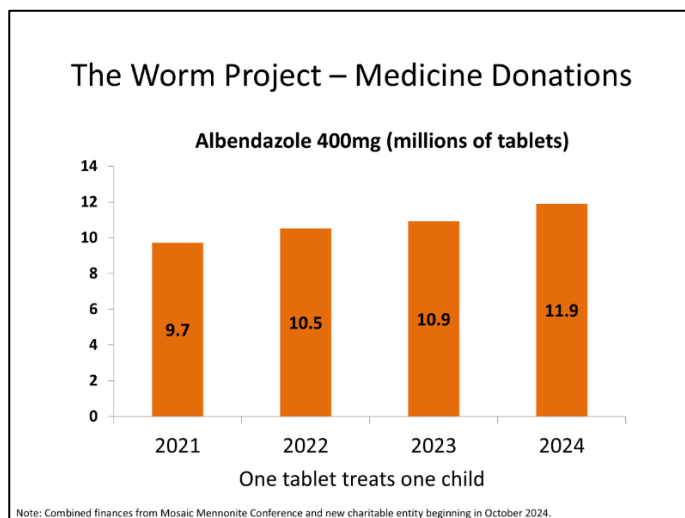
2025 CRM Annual Report to Mosaic Mennonite Conference

In 2024, Mosaic Conference encouraged and supported The Worm Project's transition from a ministry of Mosaic to an independent 501c3 charitable organization and CRM (Conference Related Ministry) of Mosaic with the official transition happening in October 2024.

Other than becoming a new charitable organization with a new mailing address, we continue with the same volunteer Board of Directors and the same mission to follow Jesus' commandment to help "the least of these."

Highlights for 2024 include:

- **The purchase and donation of deworming medicine to treat 11.9 million children (one tablet costs roughly 2.5 cents and treats one child)**
- Revenue (donations) of \$312,042 and operating expenses of only \$10,001 (excludes expense of deworming medicine)
- The Worm Project focuses on reaching children ages 1 – 4, with our medicine donations helping to treat ~10% of these children who were treated for parasitic worms worldwide
 - The WHO (World Health Organization) reported that ~100 million children ages 1 – 4 worldwide were treated in 2023, accounting for only 39% of children this age at risk for parasitic worms and needing treatment
- Parasitic worms cause physical and cognitive impairment in children due to malnutrition
